Survey of Likely Voters Statewide in Iowa regarding Public Policy Issues

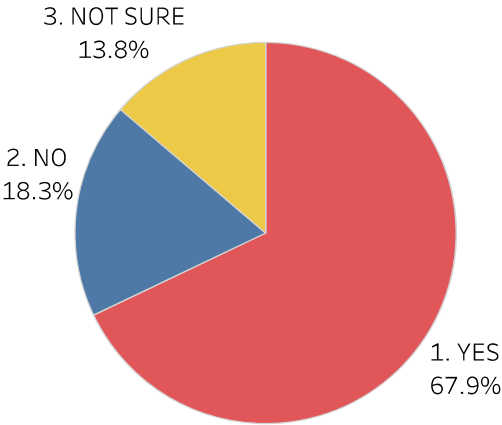

Clout Research conducted a survey of likely General Election voters statewide in Iowa regarding political issues. The survey was conducted Jan. 15-17, 2019 and included 863 respondents. It included interviews with voters in both landline (65.3% of the sample) and mobile phone-only households (34.7% of the sample), who answered topical questions on Iowa public policy and demographic questions. Two additional demographic factors were observed but not asked (phone type and congressional district). The survey carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 3.33 percentage points.

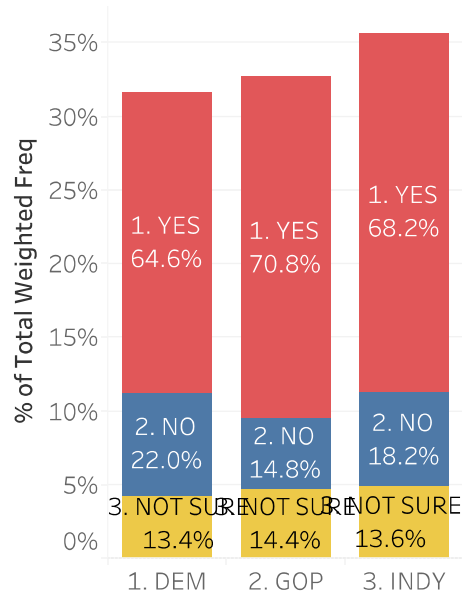

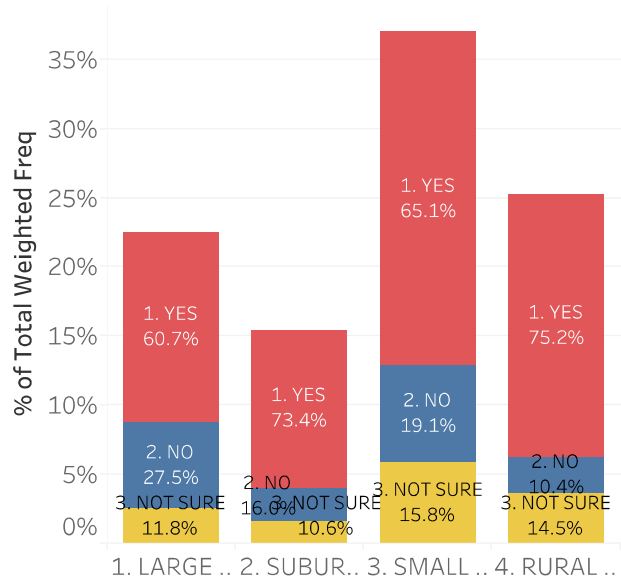
Q1 (all respondents): Do you agree or disagree that the Iowa Legislature should review the issue of property taxes during the 2019 session?

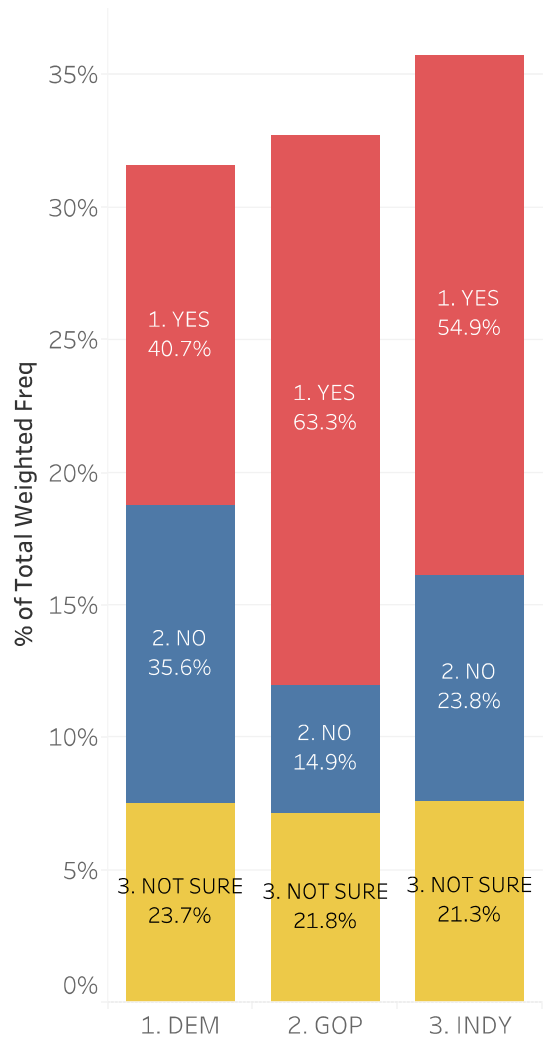

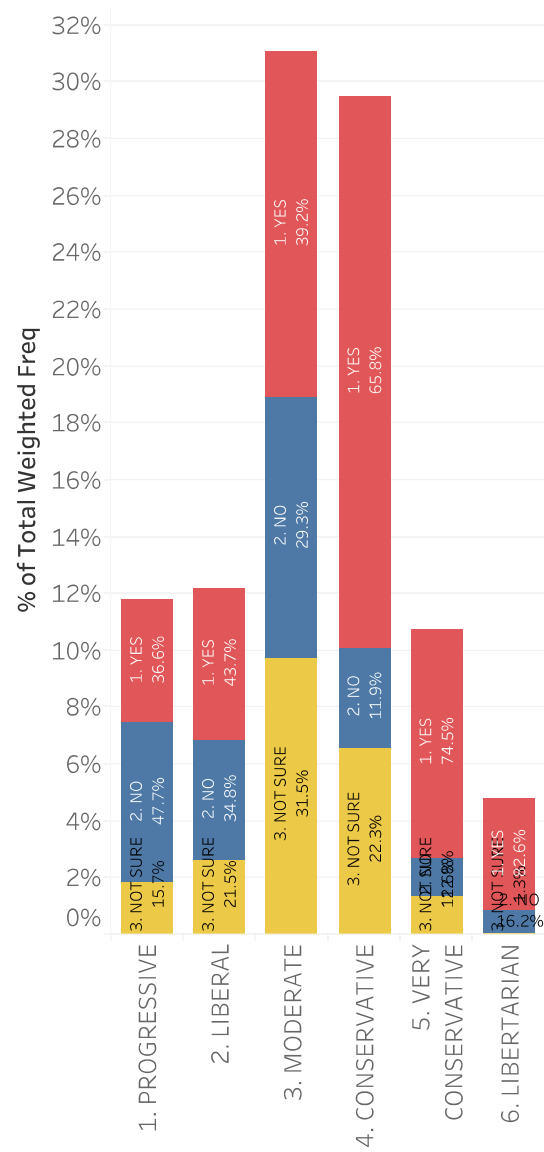

Q2 by Party: Should the legislature establish a property tax cap that limits the annual growth of taxes levied by local school districts?



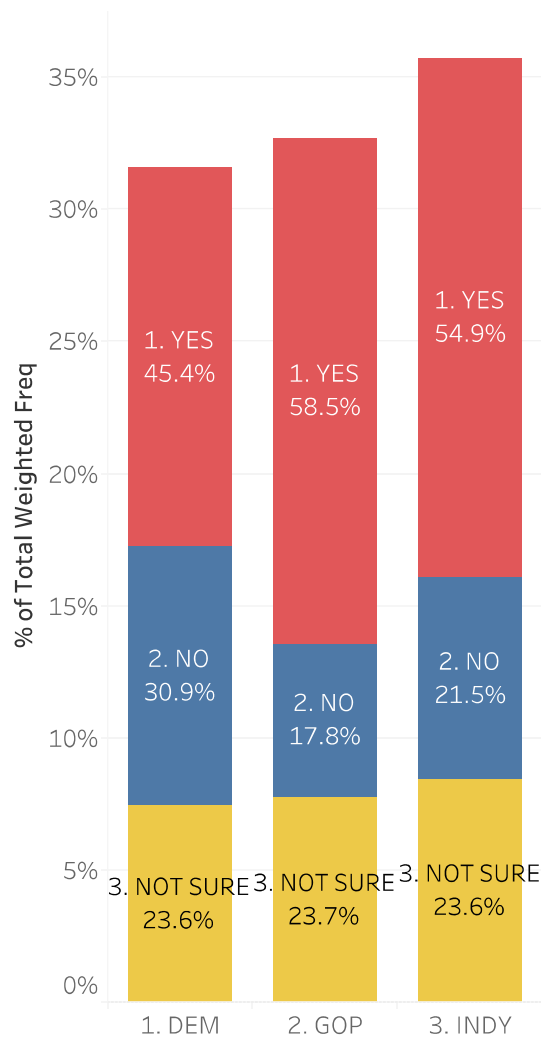
Q2 by Philosophy
